THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT

YEAR A 15 December, 2019

First Reading Is 35:1-6, 10

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

Let the wilderness and the dry-lands exult, let the wasteland rejoice and bloom, let it bring forth flowers like the jonquil, let it rejoice and sing for joy.

The glory of Lebanon is bestowed on it, the splendour of Carmel and Sharon; they shall see the glory of the Lord, the splendour of our God. Strengthen all weary hands, steady all trembling knees and say to all faint hearts, 'Courage! Do not be afraid.

'Look, your God is coming, vengeance is coming, the retribution of God; he is coming to save you.' Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, the ears of the deaf unsealed, then the lame shall leap like a deer and the tongues of the dumb sing for joy, for those the Lord has ransomed shall return.

They will come to Zion shouting for joy, everlasting joy on their faces; joy and gladness will go with them and sorrow and lament be ended.

Do not make complaints against one another, brothers, so as not to be brought to judgement yourselves; the Judge is already to be seen waiting at the gates. For your example, brothers, in submitting with patience, take the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

Jesus answered, 'Go back and tell John what you hear and see; the blind see again, and the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, and the deaf hear, and the dead are raised to life and the Good News is proclaimed to the poor; and happy is the man who does not lose faith in me.'

As the messengers were leaving, Jesus began to talk to the people about John: 'What did you go out into the wilderness to see? A reed swaying in the breeze? No? Then what did you go out to see? A man wearing fine clothes? Oh no, those who wear fine clothes are to be found in palaces. Then what did you go out for? To see a prophet? Message from Parish Priest

Common Means of Preparing for Christmas

A common practice during the season of Advent is to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation so that we can prepare our hearts to receive the gift of God's love in a profound way during Christmas. This practice is counter-cultural. Our contemporary culture conditions us to think that what makes us loveable are our accomplishments by which we prove we are worthy of attention, appreciation, acceptance, and affection. In truth, what renders us to become more receptive to the unconditional love of God is not our strengths, but our weaknesses. Even the Son of God chose to be born as a vulnerable baby in a poor stable. Thus, Jesus' birth models for us how we can be receptive to the loving, empathetic, and compassionate embrace of God the Father as well as our neighbour.

As a penitent (yes, priests receive this sacrament, too), I personally encounter Christ in ways that constantly surprise me. That the "bad news" of my sins can be exchanged for the Good News of Christ appears too good to be true; namely: his assurance that he still loves me unconditionally and that he wants to heal, strengthen, encourage and make me more like himself. There is no "raw deal" in that marvellous exchange! This encounter does not simply take place in the exchange of words themselves, because the tone of his voice, together with all the other characteristics of his demeanour, also convey Christ's compassionate and non-judgmental understanding. The more transparent I am, the more "transparent" the priest is; transparent in the sense that I can "see through" him and recognise Christ!

Extra Confession Times Before Christmas

In addition to the regular Confession times after each Mass on Monday to Saturday and one hour before the 6 pm Vigil Mass, Confession will be available on Wednesday to Friday (18–20 December) from 3–4 pm. This time may be particularly convenient if you are a parent who picks up your children after school.

A Chat with a Seminarian

Before entering the seminary I had a very strong conversion. Given I was already Catholic that might sound strange, but I had many questions. I wanted to make sense of things, to understand more deeply the beliefs of the Church. I was on a quest to discover more about what I believed. I found so much more than I expected. I would love to know if you have had similar experiences or questions. If so, I am available to chat with you and together discover a deeper experience.

So, if you are seeking after truth, have questions, queries, concerns, things you are unsure of, troubles in standing up your faith; perhaps you are wondering, "Why does the Church teach this?" "What is the Church?" – any question at all – come and chat.
