A reading from the book of Ecclesiasticus

The Lord honours the father in his children, and upholds the rights of a mother over her sons. Whoever respects his father is atoning for his sins, he who honours his mother is like someone amassing a fortune. Whoever respects his father will be happy with children of his own, he shall be heard on the day when he prays. Long life comes to him who honours his father, he who sets his mother at ease is showing obedience to the Lord. My son, support your father in his old age, do not grieve him during his life. always, because that is what will please the Lord. Parents, never drive your children to resentment or you will make them feel frustrated.

Gospel according to Matthew

There he settled in a town called Nazareth. In this way the words spoken through the prophets were to be fulfilled:

Happy New Year

As we transition into the year 2020, I want to assure you of my prayers for a happy New Year. Happiness is an elusive quality, for we cannot guarantee experiencing it when we look for it, in an effort to grasp it; rather, happiness is always the consequence of the choices we make as we strive for virtue. These choices are the ones that do not involve denying our identity in Christ in order to be loved.

As we celebrate Christmas, let us remember that Jesus' Birth has made participating in his identity possible through the Sacrament of Baptism. Embedded in Baptism is the power through the Holy Spirit to participate in Christ's identity as beloved sons and daughters of God the Father *now* in this life. God designed our hearts to enjoy the same profound intimacy Jesus enjoys with his Father. Jesus longs for his "own joy" he has with his Father to "be in you," so that "your joy be complete" (Jn. 15:11).

Excerpts' from a Homily for the Feast of the Holy Family by *St Josemaria Escriva*



At Christmas our thoughts turn to the different events and circumstances surrounding the birth of the Son of God. As we contemplate the stable in Bethlehem or the home of the Holy Family in Nazareth, Mary, Joseph and the Child Jesus occupy a special place in our hearts. What does the simple, admirable life of the Holy Family tell us? What can we learn from it?

I would like particularly to comment on one of the many considerations that we might make on this theme. As we read in Holy Scripture, the birth of Jesus means the beginning of the fullness of time. It was the moment God chose to show the extent of His love for men, by giving us his own Son. And God's will is fulfilled in the simplest, most ordinary of circumstances: a woman who gives birth, a family, a home. The power of God and his splendour come to us through a human reality to which they are joined. Since that moment Christians have known that, with God's grace, they can and should sanctify everything that is good in their human lives. There is no human situation, no matter how trivial and ordinary it may seem, which cannot be a meeting place with Christ and a step forward on our journey towards the kingdom of heaven...

To every Christian, whatever his state in life —priest or layman, married or single—we can apply fully the words of the Apostle, which we read precisely on the feast of the Holy Family: "...chosen by God, holy and beloved." This is what we all are, each one in his place and position in the world, despite our errors and in the midst of the struggle to conquer them: men and women chosen by God to give witness to Christ and to bring all those who surround us the joy of knowing that we are God's children.

Change in the Way Holy Communion is Distributed

This catechetical card on Holy Communion is available in the foyer of the church. This card was published after the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) was consulted regarding the need to provide instruction regarding why the chalice should not be offered at every Mass. For most of her history, the Roman Catholic Church has only distributed Holy Communion under the form of bread to all the faithful in the assembly.

In 1986, St Pope John Paul II made some changes to liturgical law to permit Catholic laity who congregate for Mass in Australia, under certain circumstances, to also receive the Precious Blood.

Accordingly, **from 1 January 2020** the chalice will only be offered during the special times specified in the card. If you have any questions, you can ask the Parish's clergy or any member of the PPC.
