Message from the Parish Priest

Today is the Last Day of Christmas

According to the Roman Catholic liturgical calendar, Ordinary Time does not officially begin until the Monday after the Solemnity of the Baptism of the Lord. This means that the Christmas Season actually extends beyond the so called 'Twelve Days of Christmas.' So, on behalf of Our Lady of the Rosary Parish, I hope you receive much grace on this last day of Christmas, especially since what we celebrate at Jesus' Birth has much in common with his Baptism, even though many years took place between these two events in his life.

Ultimately, just as Jesus was born in Bethlehem, God longs to be born anew in our hearts. We share God's desire in Christmas as we open up our hearts to receive him. The Sacrament of Baptism makes this new birth possible. Indeed, we are called to experience a psychological awakening to the spiritual dynamic that has already happened in the Sacrament of Baptism. Embedded in Baptism is the power through the Holy Spirit to participate in Christ's relationship with his Father *now* in this life. God designed our hearts to enjoy the same profound intimacy Jesus enjoys with his Father. Jesus longs for his "own joy" he has with his Father to "be in you," so that "your joy be complete" (Jn. 15:11).

While this joy will only be complete after our death if we are faithful to the end, Jesus wants us to experience a foretaste of this delight interiorly and mystically in a manner expressed in the Acts of the Apostles: "In him we live and move and have our being" (Acts 17:28).

Change to the Schedule for Anointing Masses

The Anointing Masses are Masses in which the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick takes place within them as a communal celebration. Thus, they provide us as a worshipping community with the opportunity to pray in solidarity for parishioners among us who are suffering from a significant or chronic illness in the hope that God in his love and compassion may bring them healing through the Anointing of the Sick.

This year, the schedule for the Anointing Masses has changed. Rather than take place on the first Friday of the month in evening and the last Saturday of the month in the morning, these Anointing Masses will take place four times a year (see front page of Parish Bulletin for more details). The reason for this change of schedule was announced at the Anointing Mass which took place on 3 January. This announcement has been published and is available in the foyer on the car park side of the church.
