LECTIONARY: YEAR B.
SUNDAY, 5TH SEPTEMBRR 2021.

COLOUR: GREEN.

1ST READING: ISIAH: 35: 4-7. RESPONSORIAL PSALM: 145: 7-10.

2ND READING: ST.JAMES: 2: 1-5. GOSPEL: MARK: 7: 31-37.

THEME: **'HE HAS DONE ALL THINGS WELL'.**

PRAYER SPACE: Dear Parents/Guardians, please prepare green tablecloth, candle, crucifix, flowers, Bible[preferably a children's Bible, Catholic edition] .

GOSPEL REFLECTION.

WHAT DO YOU HEAR IN TODAY'S GOSPEL?

Jesus meets a man who cannot hear, and who has a problem with his speech.

WHAT DOES JESUS DO TO HIM? Jesus takes the man away from the crowd, puts his fingers in the man's ears- and then touches the man's tongue with spittle, He looks up to Heaven- which is how the Bible sometimes tells us that 'Jesus was praying in the moment' and finally says the word, ' EPHPHATHA' which means 'Be opened'.

HOW DO YOU THINK THE MAN FELT?

The man is able to hear and to speak more clearly.

JESUS TELLS THE CROWD NOT TO TELL ANYONE.

But they go around telling everyone.

HOW DID THE CROWD FEEL?

Amazed and happy.

WHAT DID THE CROWD TELL EVERYONE?

‘He has done all things well,’ ‘He makes the deaf hear and the dumb speak’.

Can you think of a time when you didn’t listen well to what someone was saying? Perhaps you didn’t think what the other person is saying was important? Sometimes we find it difficult to listen.

Sometimes we find it difficult to speak up- It can be hard to speak out to something we believe in. It is not always easy to speak out for what we believe in, but Jesus asks us to try.

Can you think of a time when you knew you should say something but it was hard to do?

Will you speak out this week for what you know is right? Will you try to stand up for what you believe in even it is difficult?.

In today’s story we see Jesus step away from the noise and busy-ness of the crowd, we see Him take a moment praying to God His Father, and then we see Him healing the man who could not hear or talk.

As we learn from Jesus how to keep paying attention to God, one of the things we learn to do is to keep asking and listening to God for help even in busy moments, just like Jesus did in today’s Gospel story.

FAMILY PRAYER.

Dear Heavenly Father, you care enough for us to give us what we need, and has the wisdom to give us what is best for us in our lives. We trust in your love and care and we live in your presence and protection. From the first moment of our lives you knew and loved us, you are always close to us. 
